- Data recording discussed as was relationship with WIRES need for better networking on common issues. Exec is endeavouring to improve relationships with WIRES via L Taylor, General Manager. - Concern was expressed re. groups with shooters responsible for euthanasia of animals by firearm – all groups should ensure they have a Policy to ensure their members are not affected by drugs or alcohol during any situation where they are representing their individual group in any manner, not only with firearm use.
- Certificate of Currency correction of insured's name from Wildlife ARK to Wildlife ARC. -Insurance Officer to contact the Broker.

#### **4.2.** Euthanasia of Injured or Sick Native Fauna by 'Farmers' – Naomi Henry

- Wildlife Queanbeyan querying legality of farmers euthanasing wildlife by firearm in emergency situations.
- POCTA would most likely override other regulations on animal welfare grounds.
- In a declared emergency there is an Incident Controller who might have powers to give approvals to individuals.

 Suggested DPI Orange is contacted for details – Stephen Jackson or Matthew Crane in Animal Welfare Division.

# 4.4. NWC/IFAW Wildlife App Update - Shona Lorigan

# **4.7. Flying-Fox Crèche Fees for Adverse Events** – Jackie Maisey

- Heat stress events, first modern one in 1994, since then groups are experiencing from 1 to 4 heat stress events annually.
- Flying-fox infants are being sent to groups throughout the State and crèche fees are a real impost on groups.
- Suggestion that a fund be established to cover such emergency situations. LY Disaster Fund would be a very positive fundraising mechanism.
- Heat Stress, as a by product of climate change, is a key threatening process under the Act.

#### Action:

Writing to Federal Dept of Environment to establish what mechanisms might be available for rehabilitation groups to secure financial assistance in disaster or emergency situations affecting threatened species e.g. Grey-headed flying-foxes.

• Jackie Maisey recalls that in her opinion, the only assistance was in the 1990's for 134 animals and was from NPWS Alstonville at around \$5000.

#### Action:

To counteract Adam Marshall local member for Northern Tablelands' petition to change planning laws re. removal of flying-fox colonies, N Henry and J Maisey will develop a petition to present to Executive for approval.

### Action:

J. Maisey to draft letter to A. Marshall expressing NWC's disappointment to his attitude and actions regarding a threatened species.
