## 8. Raptors (Bird of Prey) Code of Practice progress report – S. Lorigan

Ron Haering OEH has been tasked with processing of the final Code. NWC presented final draft to OEH for further consultative process with other stakeholders to become a Code, rather than a Best Practice Guidelines. OEH was thrilled with the documents and pleased it went to an independent arbiter, Libby Hall, Taronga Wildlife Hospital.

The document has progressed to the next stage – it has been reviewed and a few changes have been made. No time frame has yet been given for approval and completion.

#### ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

**14. Rescue Baskets – Bulk import purchase for NWC groups –** M. Ryan – There have not been sufficient orders from groups to warrant a special bulk manufacture order and importation.

A<sup>11</sup> Secretary is to make recommendations on what various options are to import a quantity of rescue baskets that is economical for groups.

15. New WIRES Board – Consultative process – Audrey Koosmen

There is a new elected WIRES board. The State Council nominates the board. The new chair is Storm Sandford. NWC has been trying to build bridges with WIRES and has made contact to attempt to meet with the new board. Storm Sandford will take the request to the WIRES board to meet with NWC.

Question: WIRES was involved with all Codes of Practice facilitation meetings with the exception of wombats, but for that species WIRES provided comment after the first draft.

It is important that NWC is seen to be working closely with WIRES.

**16.** Wildlife harm caused by various weapons – A. Koosmen – (M. Ryan) Report received from Wildlife Rescue Inc about macropods being killed or harmed by bows and arrows in the Coffs Harbour area. Information sought from CEO WIRES to ensure if any action taken it shows a united front – no response received from WIRES.

Report received from Wildcare Queanbeyan of incidents where macropods have been shot with arrows.

NATF have had macropods shot by arrows. Two plovers in 2 weeks were shot by high-powered arrows.

Wildlife ARC reports of goanna with arrow; joey shot, kangaroo mother dead, two possums decapitated and a goanna speared with an arrow.

## Notes from P. Stathis presentation to meeting:

#### **Biodiversity Review:**

- Independent panel reported in 2015. Reforming aspects of Act.
- Delayed draft Bill due to controversy over vegetation clearing proposals.
- Expected Bill will be out in first 2016 trimester. There will be a Comment period.
- Believe Fauna rehab section important and believe it can be strengthened.
- Working with rehab sector and Council role will be consultative and important.
- Form of accreditation, how it can be strengthened and how it works.
- Fact sheets will be produced.
- Any concerns that need clarification call Peter Stathis in the first instance.
- Council role very important looking for coherent unified rehabilitation sector.
- More standardised training and consistent information.
- Government understands how important fauna rehab is. (May not result in investment or money on the table – need to spend time to get it right.)
- Implementation around mid-2017 won't happen all at once. It will be a transitional process.
- Question: Is accreditation likely to be to groups or individuals? PS most likely groups.
